Presentation tips

- Project your voice so that even the people at the back can hear you
- Try to match your walking speed to your group's walking speed
- Add in your own experiences where you can



Emergencies


- When the fire alarm sounds, please move safely to the nearest exit. After, make your way to one of our assembly points.

1.Starting point – Campus Restaurant

- Start by introducing yourself (first name, subject, year of study. If international, where you are from)
- Ask where they have come from today?
- Ask what they want to study? (this will help you to make your tour a little more bespoke)

Explain -

We are a **campus-based university**. So, that means we have pretty much everything a student needs on campus, except for a supermarket, but we have 3 within walking distance. ASDA, Aldi, Co-op, Tesco & Morrisons Express.

We have 2 campuses which are a 15 to 20 minute walk apart with a free shuttle bus that runs between them. We're on **De Havilland**, the smaller of the two.

It's home to Business, Education, Law & Sport

Our other campus is **College Lane**, and is home to Creative Arts, Humanities, Health and Social Work, Life and Medical Sciences, Physics, Maths, Engineering and Computer Science.

It's worth noting that you can live on either campus, regardless of where you are studying, so you want might to check out the accommodation on both.

2. Campus restaurant (continued)

- Campus restaurant has a rotating menu (with hot and cold options, catering for all dietary requirements including vegan, vegetarian, Halal, Kosher
- Open Mon-Fri 11:30-15:00

Point in direction of our institute of Sport Building

- Sports science teaching space with
- Performance labs
- Sports injury and sports therapy area
- Specialist environment room
- Facilities for the public to be assessed by students for sports injuries

3. Hertfordshire Sports Village (go into foyer, say to reception you are giving a tour)

The leisure centre is also open to the public, but students get discounts (membership)

- café sport (with starbucks, salads, wraps, sandwiches, paninis, cakes and pastries)
- 25m, 8 lane swimming pool
- 12m rock climbing wall
- Gym, with cardio, machine and free weight sections
- 3 sports halls for Badminton, Volleyball, 5 aside football, netball, basketball and more.
- Cricket hall, 2 squash courts
- Outdoor floodlit pitches and hart courts
- Physiotherapy and sports injury clinic
- We have 29 sport clubs currently (on next slide) that compete against other universities
- We have Active Students which is free for students and gives everyone a chance to try new activities
- Hosts Herts Coach Education week (lots of student discounted coaching qualifications)

Mention they can come back for a guided tour of the Sports Village.

4. Premier shop (outside (or in common room if raining

- Point out shop, de Havilland common room and multi faith space.
- Point out the accommodation office Mention they can come back after the tour to ask questions
- Point to where the buses are and where campus shuttle stops

(**Next**: Bus stops)

5. Take to bus stop

Point out and mention:

- The free shuttle runs between our two campuses & park and ride (if asked, our carpark is located at Angerland Common with is within walking distance)
- Our university bus, the UNO bus, goes from campus to Hatfield town centre and station (where
 you can get a train into London in 25 minutes), the near-by historic city of St. Albans (with pubs
 bars and restaurants), Watford, Welwyn Garden City, North London and lots of other places too.
- There is a discount for students on the UNO bus of up to 40% off when show ID card. Maximum cost for a single trip is currently £2. That includes the Arriva buses too.
- Point out multipurpose pitches also where varsity is held.
- Point out Ellenbrook Fields nature reserve (to the right of the bus stops on the other side of the road)

6. Outside Student Union Office

- SU organise all on campus events, freshers fair, summer ball, guide dog puppy play days, etc.
- Offer Ikea trips
- Off campus trips have included to Cambridge, central London, the beach, Harry Potter Studios tour, etc.
- They offer part-time jobs on campus outside of ambassador programme and volunteering opportunities
- SU is responsible for our 120 plus societies (societies tend to surround hobbies but not always). If you
 can't find one for your interest, you can always create one!
- Offer independent support and advice
- Zero tolerance report policy

7. Atrium

 Mostly accessed from this main atrium, we have 38 teaching spaces, including lecture theatres and classrooms.

Point out study booths and study space in mezzanine

8. The Weston Auditorium (foyer)

- 450 seat theatre
- The venue hosts a diverse programme of events throughout the year including
- film, music, theatre and dance
- guest lectures and speakers

If not in use, let the guests take a look inside

9. The Street

- Herts has a diverse community representing over 120 nationalities
- The flags above represent the nationalities of all current students and Herts graduates the result is an opportunity to make friends from around the world.
- ✓ This results in some great societies too.
- Encourage guests to see how many they recognise
- Flags are ordered alphabetically, so if someone is the first to graduate from their country, the flags will be rearanged.

10. Learning Resources Centre (go inside)

- Open 24/7
- An extensive collection of books and resources are available in print and online to support learning, teaching and research
- Computers, specialist software and self-service printing available plus a free laptop loan service
- Café seating area (with vending machines) for study breaks
- A range of study spaces (group, individual, quiet and silent study spaces)
- Study skills support available to all students (e.g. reference help, essay structuring, LRC orienteering etc)

Go inside, ask security to let you in as part of tour, so guests can take a look

11. Reception

This is where you'll register collect your ID badge when you start.

They'll also be able to point you in the right direction if you're not sure where to ask.

On College Lane there is our main information hub for students with access to support for pretty much everything, from finance, to wellbeing to accommodation.

Next: Enterprise Hub

12. Enterprise Hub - find a space to stand

In the Enterprise Hub:

- Café Ambition with Starbucks, with its very own living moss wall!
- There are study and hangout spaces upstairs
- In the evening the café becomes a bar
- Business incubator is a designated space for students to work on their business plans with the help of an advisor
- On the other campus, College Lane, there is a pub, bar and nightclub.
- <u>Mention Galleria</u> In walking distance (10 minutes) with shops, restaurants (most offer student discounts) & 12 screen cinema. Point in the direction of where it is.

On Open Day – point out the support stands and encourage visitors to come back later to ask questions.

13. Grace Ononiwu building (previously Law Court building)

- Renamed in honour of Grace Ononiwu CBE, a Herts graduate who became the first Afro Caribbean person to hold the post of Chief Crown Prosecutor in the history of the Crown Prosecution Service.
- Law court is a full-scale replica, with a viewing gallery, which has featured in episodes of Eastenders
 and Holby city
- Debate society also use this facility
- Home of the Pro bono Law clinic which provides free legal advice to the local community.

Accommodation FAQs - Payment

Can we choose the payment plans that is weekly or monthly?

Payments are yearly or in 3 instalments in line with student finance payments.

What are the dates of the accommodation payments?

The dates can change but the months of the dates are October, January and April.

Do I pay for my accommodation out of my maintenance loan?

The government gives you a maintenance loan based on your parents/ guardian's salary. This salary helps to fund your lifestyle while at university and not working full time. Therefore, you can choose whether to put all or some towards accommodation and other expenses.

How to pay for accommodation

You pay for accommodation through an automatic bank transfer you set up with the university.

How much is the deposit and when do we have to pay it by?

The deposit is £100, and you have to pay within 7 days of receiving your accommodation offer

Accommodation FAQs – Application Process

• When do accommodation applications open to students starting in September?

You are able to apply for accommodation once you have your student ID number from around April.

• The application process for accommodation

To apply for accommodation, you have to fill out a form with your top choices and then accept the offer within 7 days once it comes through.

When should we accept to see our offer of accommodation after we have applied?

Once you have received an offer you have 7 days to accept and pay a £100 deposit

How do I find out the length of my course to know which contract length to pick?

If you are unsure of which contract to pick, email ask@herts.ac.uk and mention the course you are looking to study

If Herts is my first choice, are we guaranteed accommodation on site?

Accommodation is guaranteed to all first-year students, as long as you meet the deadlines and we can accommodate your needs.

Accommodation FAQs – Communal areas & overall flat

What appliances are supplied in the kitchen?

In the kitchen there are fridges, freezers, hobs, kettles, microwaves, toasters, an iron, an ironing board, hoover and a mop.

Can I have people stay?

Yes, you are allowed to have someone stay over once a week.

Are the flats mixed?

All flats are mixed unless requested otherwise for a same sex flat.

Can you live with friendship groups?

Yes, when applying for accommodation you can request to live with friends in groups up to 4.

Are any of our rooms / flats / blocks were designated as 'quiet' accommodation

Unfortunately, there isn't a designated quite block as it is hard to control noise. However, we have security 24/7 who you can report any noise complaints too.

Accommodation FAQs - MISC

Can I move into halls if I live nearby?

Yes, you can live in halls even if you live in close proximity to the university.

Is there a curfew or anything like that?

There is not curfew at university

Can you stay on campus in year 2/3

You are able to stay on campus in year 2/3 but accommodation is not guaranteed.

Which blocks were modern and which ones were old

The College Lane accommodation is our newest accommodation on campus.

Where do I clean my clothes on campus / concerns about laundry?

At College Lane campus, there are card operated laundries in each of the courtyard common rooms. On de Havilland campus, there are five card operated laundries in the Halls of residence.

It's £3.60 per wash and £2 per dry.

Applicants must have:

Applied for accommodation before 15th August 2024

Confirmed Acceptance of a place to study before 22nd August 2024

Clearing Guarantee

Applicants must have:

Been offered a place on a course or an interview by 16th August 2024

Referred themselves via UCAS Track by 18th August 2024

Made an accommodation application by 20th August
